18 year old Harry Moore from Charlton is one of the most recent graduates of the Buloke/Loddon TAC L2P program obtaining his licence in late October this year.

It caps off a big year for Harry who has recently completed his VCE via Distance Education studying English, Accounting, Business Management and Food Technology, and is currently waiting for his results later this month.

Harry, who suffers from ADHD and autism, loves the freedom that having his licence now provides him in terms of employment options, and hopes to now be able to work and travel his way around Australia once he has a car of his own.

A seasoned traveller, Harry has lived in Katherine in the Northern Territory; Townsville and Harvey Bay in Queensland; and Shepparton and now Charlton in Victoria (which he loves).

Harry said he really struggled learning to drive with his mum and dad because, like most parents, they were not expert driving instructors so it was great to be able to access the Buloke/Loddon TAC L2P program.

"I really enjoyed learning to drive with Peter Aurisch (Buloke/Loddon L2P Coordinator and Mentor), as he always remained calm and clear with his directions, and he was able to provide me with written instructions to reinforce the practical learning," said Harry.

"I would highly recommend the Buloke/Loddon TAC L2P program to other young people as a means to helping them get their licence," he said.

Instructor Peter Aurish said he thoroughly enjoyed helping Harry learn to drive over the last eight months and looks forward to receiving a postcard – or two – from him once he hits the road on his big Australian travel adventure.

"It is great to be able to work with young people who otherwise would not be able to obtain their licence for a variety of reasons.

"Living in small isolated rural communities, a licence is a really important way for young people to connect to education, employment and social opportunities in the broader region," he said.
