2021 Early entry Admission Program Australian Catholic University (ACU)



Have you volunteered in a sporting or cultural group, parish or community service activity? ACU's Community Achiever Program (CAP) is designed to acknowledge commitment to local communities. Regular volunteer work in your community – through a social justice organisation, sporting, performance, cultural or religious group – may be rewarded through ACU's Community Achievers' Program with entry into an undergraduate degree.

A successful CAP application means you could receive a conditional offer as early as September to study at ACU in 2021. Being part of this CAP group also offers unique opportunities to enhance your leadership and volunteering skills, while you study.

If you are considering listing an ACU course as one of your course preferences it is worthwhile applying for this early entry program. Applications for the Australian Catholic University's Community achiever program (CAP) open on May 1st and close September 2nd (Ballarat Campus) and 12th August (Melbourne Campus).

The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) processes University Applications (and other tertiary institutions including **some** TAFE courses) in the state of Victoria. Applications for 2021 Entry (even if you are planning on deferring) open in Early August. You can list up to 8 different courses in preferential order in your course list.

Please Note: If you are currently searching for courses through VTAC you need to search via Course Search (Archive) due to Mid-year applications currently being open (for Post Year 12 students).

There are many different types of Scholarships for 2021 study – including University and TAFE studies. If you are applying for Courses via VTAC, you simply have to fill out one Scholarship application via (from August onwards) and this application will be sent out to all the Universities on your course preference list (excluding ACU and Federation University who use a different Scholarship system).
