

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




Student Number by School and Destination


Average of % chosen destination by Destination



Recommendations

- Backbone support for facilitation of **place-based partnerships** such as SFSC & SYSC
- Support for Passions and Pathways
- Review of **cost and barriers** to students accessing higher education
- Encouragement and incentives to support collaborations with industry to explore placebased, more sustainable, grow-your-own solutions
- Exploring and funding **quality rural ECEC delivery models**
- Consult with rural Principals/schools to simplify admin processes, consolidate several portals and support Principals' wellbeing
- Rural schools supported to **access local and regional resources** and a more flexible approach to accessing the most appropriate service available
- **Per-capita funding** to be reviewed in terms of constraints on enabling adequate well-being support in rural areas
