

Activity 4

Explore occupations using the *Career bullseyes*

Introduction

The purpose of this activity is to introduce you to the information available about occupations on myfuture through 33 different learning areas.

Objectives

- To encourage exploration of the wide range of occupations available on the myfuture website.
- To help you gain awareness of the scope of choices associated with occupations.
- To help you understand the relationship between learning areas and occupations.


Education and training levels

Before you begin this activity, familiarise yourself with the four education and training levels:

- **Level 1** usually has a skill level equal to the completion of Year 10, a Certificate I, or Certificate II qualification. Australian Apprenticeships may also be offered at this level.
- **Level 2** usually has a skill level equal to a Certificate III, Certificate IV, or at least 3 years of relevant experience. Australian Apprenticeships may also be offered at this level.
- **Level 3** usually requires a level of skill equal to a Diploma or Advanced Diploma. Study is often undertaken through TAFEs or Registered Training Organisations. Some universities offer studies at this level.
- **Level 4** usually requires the completion of a Bachelor Degree or higher qualification. Study is often undertaken at university.



Instructions

1. Go to <https://myfuture.edu.au/bullseyes> .
2. Select a learning area that you would like to explore further. There are 33 learning areas in total, and each one displays the occupation titles and the level of training and education required.
3. Each learning area is divided into the four education and training levels and provides direct links to the occupation profiles.
4. Select three occupations that you would like to explore further. Answer the questions below by locating the required information within each occupation profile.

Questions

- Name at least three of the tasks performed in this occupation.
- What skill level is required for this occupation? What does this mean?
- What related courses exist? Name at least three.
