### WHEN DO I APPLY FOR COURSES?



From 29<sup>th</sup> July 2024 Year 12 students are able to create their individual VTAC accounts. VTAC is the organisation that handles all University applications for Victoria – you do not apply directly to any of the Universities. VTAC also handles some TAFE and Private Provider applications. All Schools will support their Year 12 students to create their VTAC accounts and apply for Scholarships/SEAS (Special Entry Access Scheme).

The USI is a unique identifier which keeps an online record of your education and training qualifications.

## OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

### AUSTRALIAN ARMY CADETS



The Australian Army Cadets is a **national youth development program** that proudly shares the character and values of the Australian Army. It is a partnership between the Australian Army and the community. The Cadet Program is enabled and supported by Army, it is supervised by adult volunteers from the community, and cadets not only participate but also have opportunities to develop their abilities and lead their peers.

Australian Army Cadets seeks to build key attributes within youth by instilling a sense of:

- **Identity** - cadets wear the uniform of the Australian Army, with cadet insignia
- **Purpose** – cadets participate in community activities and assist and help develop junior cadets
- **Belonging** – cadets organise and lead activities and, through their leadership group, have a strong voice in the development of the Program

The minimum age for cadet membership is 12, provided the cadet will turn 13 in the calendar year of their enrolment. The maximum age for a cadet enrolment is their 17<sup>th</sup> birthday. Cadets age out of the program at the end of the calendar year of their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.
