Hands-on learning experience

Instead of spending most of your time in a classroom, you'll have the opportunity to work directly in your chosen field. This means you'll gain practical skills and experience right from the start and is a great way to apply what you learn in real-world situations.

Earn while you learn

Perhaps one of their biggest benefits is that apprenticeships come with a pay check – you're essentially being paid to learn and grow in your chosen career. This can be a huge advantage over university, where you'll need to find a job on the side if you want to earn some cash, or in some cases undertake unpaid placements to become qualified.

Early career progression

You can start building a network and making valuable industry connections that might come in handy down the track.

A direct path to employment

Lots of apprenticeships come with a direct pathway into a job. Many employers who offer apprenticeships end up hiring their apprentices as full-time employees after they complete the program.

Is an apprenticeship right for me?

If you thrive in a hands-on environment and prefer practical learning over traditional classroom settings, an apprenticeship could be perfect for you. But don't forget your apprenticeship will still involve some study too – plus, you'll be committing to a real job and all the responsibility that entails as well. This includes turning up on time, doing what you're asked, and adding value to your workplace.

University

For some people, university might be a better fit. Your dream job may require a specific academic qualification or demand a deep theoretical understanding. Or you may simply learn better in an academic setting, rather than a more hands on learning environment.
