Scope/ Purpose of project:

In late 2016 the SFR determined to review the progress that had been made since its inception in 2013 and to chart course for the future work of the group. The pre planning for the facilitated session identified that over the 3 ½ years, the group has had multiple objectives, and it is clear that a refinement of some of this work would support:

- the capacity for recognizing achievements and celebrating success
- the SFR be able to clearly articulate its purpose and priorities for the next two years
- provide a platform to support the induction of new members and participants
- provide a platform from which additional focused partnerships(possibly consisting of only some members of the group depending on the identified focus of the work) may evolve
- enable the SFR to have a documented plan which might support identification and allocation of additional resources to support children , youth and families in St Arnaud
- more clearly identify the work of SFR with that of other policy platforms both locally, state wide and nationally

The consultation asked participants to discuss and articulate their considerations around the role of the SFR : in particular did the group wish to retain its very *broad* agenda or narrow the focus to one or two specific targeted priorities areas that would enable a more 'pure' approach to ' Collective Impact " (CI) rather than the current approach where the *general* principles of CI are used but the SFR group is not focused on a single measurable agreed population or performance outcome.

<u>The Result</u>: Participants felt that a broader *agenda* was more suitable to the depth and breadth of agencies seeking to collaborate and a more refined focus may diminish the breadth of representation and diversity of resources that need to be coordinated to improve the lives of children and young people. It was agreed that smaller targeted partnerships would still be *enabled* and result from the strategic intelligence, relationships and agree actions that will be supported by the SFR.
